

Membership Requirements

Membership in the IAGMP is annual and has to be extended every calendar year after the first year of membership. It is limited to qualified practitioners who hold the international diploma of the Grinberg Method, and comply with the IAGMP's *Statutes, Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct* and the *Professional Guidelines*. Members are required to keep valid the documents they submitted prior to joining the IAGMP (Application form and professional insurance) and to comply with the following:

1. Professional level

- Attend one yearly supervision or one other format of further professional learning offered by the Grinberg Method (CLP, CRP, international courses, subject days...) to validate the member's professional level.
- Upon becoming qualified practitioners - being eligible to receive the international diploma - practitioners are invited to join the IAGMP without supervision or other further professional learning offered by the Grinberg Method during that calendar year, and will not be required to do a supervision to extend their membership in the following year.

2. Working hours with clients

- Members are recommended to have a minimum annual amount of 1,000 session hours during 10 years of membership to collect 10,000 hours of work experience.

3. Fees

- Members pay an annual membership fee.
- New members are not required to pay for their membership during the calendar year that appears on their international diploma.

4. Continuous professional and personal development

- Members are recommended to continuously develop professionally within the professional learning structures of the Grinberg Method, i.e. private lessons, consultancies and advanced studies.

5. Insurance

- Members will maintain an ongoing professional insurance as Grinberg Method practitioners with coverage for their country of practice, the EU countries, as well as for Israel, Switzerland or the USA when relevant.

Upon extending the membership, failure to comply with any of the above requirements will oblige the member to pass a second evaluation. This evaluation will be defined by the IAGMP, fitting in its timing and essence to the requirement the member has failed to pass, and in any case should occur no later than six months after the specific requirement was checked. In case of a further failure, the membership will be ended. The decision of the second evaluation is final and is not subject to any appeal.

Members who failed to extend their membership may apply for membership in the following calendar year.

Qualified practitioners who wish to join the IAGMP later than the calendar year in which they received their international diploma will be required to pass a supervision to be accepted as members.

In the event of not practicing the profession for a period longer than six months, members are asked to contact the IAGMP's secretary to inquire about any specific conditions they must meet in order to maintain their membership.

These *Membership Requirements* were adopted by the founding General Meeting of 12.08.2011, in Berlin and updated by the General Meeting of 21./22.11.2015 in Berlin.
